

The AIADMK Split: A Case Study of Political Fragmentation in Tamil Nadu

Abstract

The dissolution of All India Anna Dravida MunnetraKazhagam (AIADMK) was a significant turning point in Tamil Nadu's political history. This case study examines the consequences of the division and how it has caused political fragmentation in the digital era.

The death of its leader, Jayalithaa, caused the AIADMK, once a formidable force in Tamil Nadu politics, to be divided destructively. The dissolution of the party led to the emergence of new parties such as the Amma Makkal MunnetraKazhagam (AMMK) and the All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (Puratchi Thalaivi Amma). This divide has altered voter loyalties and diminished the credibility of the AIADMK.

Tamil Nadu's political environment has been significantly impacted by the digital age. Social media platforms enable parties to interact with voters, spread information, and influence public opinion, making them essential instruments for political mobilization. Among the new problems brought about by the digital age are the propagation of hate and false information.

This case study investigates how the AIADMK split has impacted Tamil Nadu's political landscape, with an emphasis on the role of digital media, using a variety of sources, such as interviews with political leaders, activists, and voters, as well as an analysis of social media data and news coverage. It examines the impact of the division on politics. It explores how the split has contributed to political fragmentation and how digital media has shaped the political discourse in the State.

Introduction

Since the All-India Anna Dravida Munnettra Kazhagam (AIADMK) split, Tamil Nadu's political climate has undergone substantial shift. The AIADMK, which has dominated Tamil Nadu politics since 1972, experienced a severe schism following the passing of its well-liked leader, Jayalalithaa. State politics are greatly impacted by this fragmentation, particularly in the digital era when social media platforms have emerged as essential instruments for political mobilization. Other groups emerged, such the All India Anna Dravida Munnettra Kazhagam (Puratchi Thalaivi Amma) and the Amma Makkal Munnettra Kazhagam (AMMK), which are currently led by former Chief Minister O. Panneerselvam. Actor Vijay recently launched Tamilaga Vetri Kazhagam, one of the newest political groups. Voter loyalty has shifted, institutional trust has fallen, hate and lies have multiplied, and the AIADMK's legitimacy has decreased as a result of this party's growth.

Role of digital media

The internet age has been crucial in forming Tamil Nadu's political environment. Social media platforms are becoming crucial tools for political mobilization because they allow parties to communicate with voters, disseminate information, and sway public opinion.

Misinformation and mobilization: Social media has become a two-edged sword that can facilitate rapid mobilization while also spreading misleading information, fostering internal party conflict, and undermining public trust in party leadership.

Comparative weakness: Studies reveal that the AIADMK lags behind rivals like the DMK in terms of digital strategy due to blatant factionalism and inconsistent messaging that weakens its online presence.

Youth engagement: Party officials have recognized the need to expand digital outreach, particularly to younger people, despite the fact that internal disputes have impeded coordinated efforts.

Election Commission role in party splits

Resolving disagreements over party symbols is a critical function of the Election Commission of India (ECI). The ECI decides who

gets the emblem based on the provisions of the Symbols Order, 1968. In addition to the support of MPs, MLAs, and party delegates, the Commission considers factors such as the party's aims, objectives, and constitution.

Impact on Tamil Nadu politics

The AIADMK split would have a big effect on Tamil Nadu politics. The dissolution of the party has damaged its legitimacy, and the emergence of new groups has altered the political landscape in the State. The digital age has created new problems, such as the spread of misleading information and a loss of institutional trust.

The historic 1985 Tamil Nadu Assembly election

An unusual political climate prevailed during the Tamil Nadu Assembly election of 1985. The founder and leader of the AIADMK party, Dr. M.G. Ramachandran (MGR), was in a U.S. hospital during the campaign. While he was overseas, the party's second-in-command, Mr. R.M. Veerapan, took over as leader of the campaign across Tamil Nadu.

Despite his absence, MGR was nominated by the AIADMK for the Andipatti seat. With a surprise victory and a second consecutive term in power, the AIADMK made the election historic. The 1985 vote is significant in Tamil Nadu's political history not only because the party won the election but also because its leader ran a virtual campaign from a hospital abroad for the first time.

The AIADMK's second-in-command, Mr. R. M. Veerapan, led a state-wide campaign while its leader, Dr. M. G. Ramachandran (MGR) was in a hospital getting treatment. Videos and pictures of MGR receiving treatment were widely circulated and aired in every constituency in Tamil Nadu. The AIADMK's campaign approach relied heavily on these visual aids, which were highly effective in capturing the public's attention.

MGR and Jayalalithaa: A dynamic partnership in Tamil Nadu politics

The Rise of MGR: MG Ramachandran, a well-known actor, created the Anna-Dravida Munnettra Kazhagam (AIADMK) by exploiting his on-screen persona as a messiah. In his films, he was portrayed as the champion of the poor, which deeply connected with

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the public. He led the party to wins in the 1977, 1980, and 1985 elections, establishing his reputation as a leading figure in Tamil Nadu politics.

Jayalalithaa's Ascension: Jayalalithaa, who began her acting career as a child, was mentored by MGR, and she went on to become a powerful politician in her own right. As a political team, they were just as strong when paired with MGR on-screen. Following MGR's passing, Jayalalithaa succeeded him and became Tamil Nadu's sixth chief minister. However, allegations of corruption tarnished her career; her mentor, MGR, was also criticized for this during his time away from the DMK.

Objective

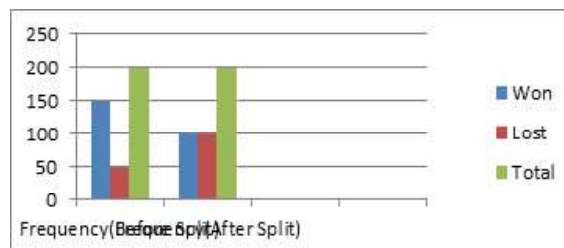

Critical analysis

Chi-Square test

Significant association between the AIADMK split and the party's electoral performance in Tamil Nadu

The Chi-Square test result indicates a significant association between the AIADMK split and the party's electoral performance in Tamil Nadu ($p < 0.05$). The split had a negative impact on the party's electoral performance.

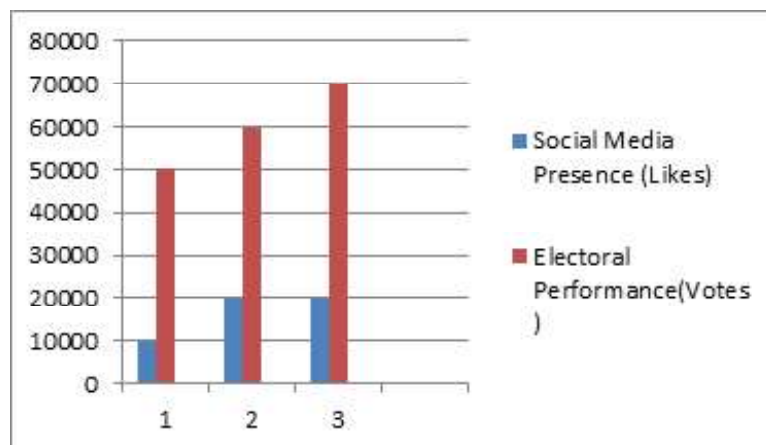
Correlation test

Regression analysis

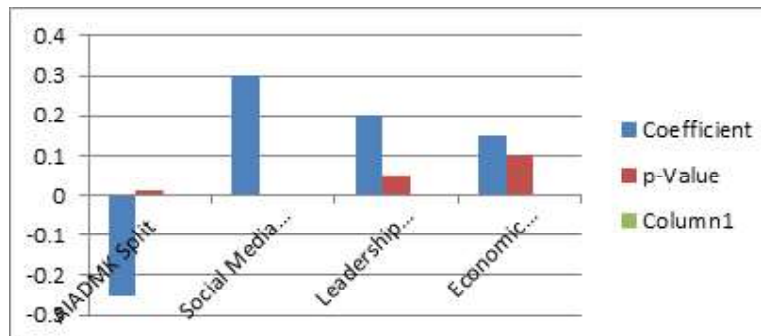

The split and the polity

The AIADMK's performance in 2024 reflects a party in crisis. Seven years after Jayalalithaa's death, it has not succeeded in projecting a leader with equivalent authority or charisma. Edappadi K. Palaniswami (EPS) has emerged as the dominant figure within the party, but his leadership has failed to stabilise the organisation or present a compelling alternative to the DMK. The party's vote share, which has now eroded to nearly 20 per cent, is not insignificant, but it lacks spatial concentration and coherence. This electoral thinning coincides with an ideological drift.

I wouldn't agree that AIADMK has suffered a split. The fact is expelled AIADMK leader TTV Dhinakaran has launched a new party AMMK. Likewise another expelled leader O Panneerselvam contested as an Independent candidate in 2024 Lok Sabha polls and has withdrawn support for BJP or NDA ahead of the 2026 assembly elections. However social media may be used to set a false narrative against these two leaders deliberately or inadvertently concerned political parties, individuals or groups with vested interest.

The AIADMK's decline can be attributed to its inability to adapt to changing times and its lack of emphasis on digital media. The party's leadership has not been able to connect with the younger generation, and its IT wing has not been effective in promoting the party's ideology and agenda.

The AIADMK needs to revamp its digital strategy and focus on building a strong online presence to stay relevant in today's digital age. The party needs to learn from the successes of other parties, such as the DMK, and adapt to the changing political landscape.
